
We have developed a small group culture that will allow you as a leader to meet everyone where they are and through the Holy Spirit, lead them further in their walk with God.

Small Groups Provide Three Things

1. A place to connect

It's easy to feel alone in a crowd. Small groups are an open door into the life of our church family and steps on the road to becoming a fully devoted follower of Jesus. When you're in a small group, you experience the love, acceptance, and strength of a Biblical community.

Let us think of ways to motivate one another to acts of love and good works. And let us not neglect our meeting together, as some people do, but encourage one another, especially now that the day of his return is drawing near.

Hebrews 10:24-25 NLT

2. A place of support

Imagine having someone to call when you're discouraged, someone to pray with when you are doubting, and someone who can tell you more about what God is like. Imagine a loving community of people who notice when you're away, sharpen you when needed, and help you share your faith with others. Small groups provide that place of protection and support.

We know what real love is because Jesus gave up His life for us. So we also ought to give up our lives for our brothers and sisters.

1 John 3:16 NLT

3. A place to grow

Small groups are a place where true discipleship takes place. They allow you to learn what you need to mature in your faith, to become a disciple: A place to be taught how to follow Jesus; A place to learn Jesus' words; A place to learn Jesus' way of ministry; A place to learn how to imitate Jesus' life and character; A place where you can encourage others in their pursuit of Jesus.

For this very reason, make every effort to add to your faith goodness; and to goodness, knowledge; and to knowledge, self-control; and to self-control, perseverance; and to perseverance, godliness; and to godliness, mutual affection; and to mutual affection, love. For if you possess these qualities in increasing measure, they will keep you from being ineffective and unproductive in your knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. 2 Peter 1:5-8

The Why Behind Small Groups

To accomplish the mission of Love Church, there are five plays on your journey to becoming a disciple of Jesus:

- 1. Prayer
- 2. Sunday Services
- 3. Small Groups
- 4. Serving
- 5. Giving

All five of these plays are vital to your growth, but play #3 is the area of focus for this guide.

Life change happens in the context of <u>relationships</u>.

Each disciple must pursue the inspiration of leadership (seek vision), have accountability, find structure (follow a growth plan), and seek relationship.

It's the heart of God for us to be in genuine relationship with people. Relationships define us, grow us, challenge us, strengthen us, and bless us.

At Love Church, we believe our church family must grow <u>larger</u> and <u>smaller</u> at the same time; being a church <u>of</u> small groups not a church <u>with</u> small groups.

Small groups are the vehicle through which pastoral care takes place. They provide a setting to build dynamic relationships and facilitate individual spiritual growth. Small groups are a smaller family within a larger church family.

Small group leaders are an <u>extension</u> of the pastoral staff of Love Church.

Small groups are important for handling many of the <u>pastoral care</u> functions of the church. Providing the personal touch people need, especially in a crisis.

Our Framework For Small Groups

The What Behind Small Groups

Small groups are purposely designed to align with the mission of Love Church, to create fully devoted followers of Jesus. The framework for small groups is four specific tracks. With our standard and free-market groups landing under the Outreach, Care + Support, and Recreational Tracks, which offer connection to God and people. Special emphasis is placed on the fourth track called Discipleship. The Discipleship Track is specifically designed to develop one's maturity and growth in God, and their role at Love Church.




Outreach Track

Description: Small groups that meet at varying times of the week and/or month to serve our community.

Who can join? Anyone

Who can lead? Leaders who've completed Church 101 (or equivalent).




Care + Support Track

Description: Small groups that are designed to provide care and support when dealing with specific areas or topics of life. For example, small groups in this track may focus on restoring your finances, your marriage, emotional healing, or addressing an addiction.

Who can join? Anyone

Who can lead? Leaders who've completed Step 2 of the Discipleship Track.




Recreational Track

Description: Small groups that are structured around a free market approach of fellowship and connection. This track allows leaders to turn their existing relationships, interests, and hobbies into small groups where people can foster community.

Who can join? Anyone

Who Can Lead? Leaders who've completed Church 101 (or equivalent).



Discipleship Track


This track is designed to take each participant through a biblically-based 4-step process toward becoming a more mature, fully devoted follower of Jesus. It is geared to allow small groups to be more intentional about growing one's relationship with God and being led by the Holy Spirit.

Step 1 – Foundation Groups: For new believers and participants who want to learn about key biblical principles and take the next steps in their new-found faith.

Step 2 – Freedom Groups: Participants learn to remove every obstacle to intimacy with God and walk in true freedom.

Step 3 – Journey Groups: Transitional Phase for taking participants deeper in their faith and calling.

Step 4 - Leadership: Participants learn to live and lead through the Holy Spirit.




Step 1: Foundation Groups

Description: Small groups designed to take new believers through the early steps of their new faith in Christ and increase their foundational knowledge of who God is and what their faith can lead to.

Who can join? Anyone

Who can lead? Leaders who've completed Step 2 of the Discipleship Track.




Step 2: Freedom Groups

Description: Small groups that are designed to equip you to live the victorious and abundant life Christ came to give you. Freedom groups build on the foundation of your faith in Christ to help you embrace the truth of God's Word as it relates to your worldview, your past, your sin, your personal value to God, and your purpose in His Kingdom. This group will help you remove every obstacle to intimacy with God and walk in true freedom.

Who can join? Anyone

Who can lead? Leaders who've completed Step 2 of the Discipleship Track and Freedom Leader Training.




Step 3: Journey Groups

Description: Small groups that are designed to equip each participant with a stronger understanding of Love Church culture and tools to mature in their faith. These groups consist of Pastor-led biblical teachings, Bible study groups, or preapproved, biblically-based curriculum available in our small group library.


Who can join? Participants who've completed Step 2 of the Discipleship Track.

Step 4: Leadership

Description: Small groups focused on cultivating each participant's leadership capabilities and on developing disciple-makers.



A Community Within A Community

Love Church is a church of small groups not a church with small groups. To ensure this objective is continuously maintained, we've created ways to make it easier to connect on levels that foster stronger, deeper connections for men and women alike through Brotherhood and Sisterhood.

Brotherhood and Sisterhood are sub-communities within the existing small group communities that:

- -Allow men and women to connect beyond just the small group(s) they're in. As a man, you automatically become part of Brotherhood—and as a woman, you automatically become a part of Sisterhood.
- -Both offer events throughout the year where participants across all small group tracks come together to connect and grow along their journey no matter which small group(s) they may be in.

As a Love Church small group leader we expect you to be running all 5 plays of Love Church and be living out our church values.

Love Church Plays

1. Prayer: Engage in weekly prayer

2. Sunday Services: Regularly attend Sunday services3. Small Groups: Participate in or lead a small group

4. Serve Team: Join a Serve Team

5. Giving: Tithe regularly

Love Church Values

Heart After God: We are desperate for the presence of God and relentless about honoring Him in all that we do.

Humble Confidence: We are humble because it's not about us, and we are confident because it's not up to us.

Hard Work: We don't let the world outhustle the church.

Good Vibe: We are healthy, honest, positive, and fun.

Generational Leadership: We lead with integrity and longevity, passing it on better than

we received it, so that our impact outlives us.

Generous Spirit: We believe that we can't outgive God because the more we give, the more we receive.

Grateful Heart: We are grateful in all circumstances because even if God doesn't give us anything else, He's already given us enough.

Small Group Leader Role

Your primary role as a small group leader is to assess the spiritual condition of your group members and help them move further in their walk with Christ.

Responsibilities

- Pray daily for everyone in your group
- Check in every other week with your Campus Coordinator or Director
- Provide an environment in which group members feel:
 - → Confidentiality is being maintained
 - → Grace is being given to all
 - → Affirmed and supported
 - → Patience is being extended at all times
- Provide pastoral care to your group members
- Encourage your group to serve during Love Week
- Manage members and attendance in Planning Center (PCO)
- Serve at the Small Group kiosk two Sundays a year

Background Check

Love Church requires a background check for everyone who leads a small group as part of our efforts to ensure that safety is a priority for our church family. We believe this is important to implement because small group leaders are considered an extension of leadership in the church and offer a level of pastoral responsibility over their small groups. With such an important role, safety and precaution are always best practice!


If you serve on a team at Love Church that has already required a background check, then that will meet the requirement as a small group leader too. If you have not had a background check (or if the one on file has expired), an email will be sent to you with a link to complete the form and submit it for processing. The process will review criminal records only (and not driver or motor vehicle records), and results are usually received in just a few days.

Please note that Love Church believes that everyone, regardless of their past, has the right to be fairly assessed for a role they may be qualified to hold. Therefore, if results come back with negative information, that does not automatically disqualify someone from leading a small group. In such an instance, an invitation will be sent to meet with leadership to engage in further discussions. This approach will allow the opportunity to supply additional details and make note of any positive actions taken to overcome what was found in the background check. All information will then be considered before a final decision is made on leading a group.

Emphasis on Discipleship

To accomplish the mission of Love Church, small group leaders must be intentional in making sure each group member is taking their next step in their walk with Christ.

As a small group leader, you are critical to each of your group members growth plan. It doesn't matter what group you are leading or what track your leading out of, you should always be encouraging each of your group members to progress to or through the Discipleship Track.




What Does That Look Like?

If you're leading a small group in the Care + Support, Outreach, or Recreational Tracks, encourage your group members to join a Foundation Group (Step 1) in the Discipleship Track when your group ends (or in addition to your group).

If you're leading a Foundation Group (Step 1) within the Discipleship Track, it's important to eventually encourage your group members to transition to a Freedom Group (Step 2) within the Discipleship Track.

Each leader should look to do everything they can to encourage each person to grow. This could mean that the next growth point might be outside your group, and this is a great thing!

Each person's faith journey is different from another's and will most likely involve more than just one thing, one group, one decision or one person for God to do everything He wants to do in each of us.



How To Launch A Successful Small Group

What, How, Who, When, and Where?

What Type of Small Group?

Lead a small group that you would like to attend. You'll be leading it, so lead out of what you are passionate about and will enjoy.

How To Lead

After determining what type of small group to lead, there are primarily two approaches you can take on how to lead it:

Gate Keeper Approach – When you select a specific study or topic that you are passionate about and want to lead a small group on that same study/topic over and over. Once the study is complete, you encourage the group members to move on to a new group and then begin leading it again with new members.

Shepherd Approach – When you lead a small group and decide to keep the same members to go through different studies and topics together. You basically decide to "do life together" with your group members and walk the journey of becoming fully devoted followers of Jesus together.

Who To Invite

- Start with people you know (co-workers, friends, neighbors).
- Talk with people at church new to church, new believers, or have shown interest in getting involved.

- People you see potential in. Help them grow in who God has created them to be.
- Pray! Ask God to open your eyes to people.

When To Meet

Small groups can meet anytime throughout the week, during the day or evening. When deciding on the day and time of your group, think about what works best within your work and family schedule.

Where To Meet

If you cannot meet in your own home, look for a host home (possibly the home of someone attending your group). Other possibilities for meeting locations include:

Restaurant or Coffee Shop Library Conference Room Recreation Center Subdivision Clubhouse Outdoors in a Park Church Building

Set A Good Environment

Some things to consider when choosing a location:

Cleanliness
Enough seating and space
Refreshments
Distractions minimized (noise, pets, etc...)
Comfortable temperature
Unlocked door so people can enter like they're family.

Childcare

Childcare is important to small groups, especially for family small groups. How to handle childcare is up to the leader(s), but it is essential that consideration be made regarding this.

Small Group Guidelines

Practical Rules

- Greet people with a smile and a sincere heart.
- Encourage them by bringing God's Word to their circumstances.
- Address them by name as you talk and pray with them.

Confidentiality

This is a must in all small groups as it allows people to be transparent, authentic, and open in a very safe environment. State this right at the beginning of starting your group, ask everyone to commit to it, and say it again periodically, especially when someone new joins.

Discussion Time

Avoid doing all the talking. Use the "70/30" rule:

- → 70% of speaking should be from members of the group
- → 30% from the leader.

What happens if you ask a question and no one answers?

- → Silence is okay! It's giving people time to think.
- → If silence continues, rephrase the question.

Having a Co-Leader or Leading in Three's

Leading in threes or having a co-leader for your small group is optional, but strongly encouraged. Leading in threes means to identify one of each following type people who can help manage the group logistics:

Facilitator: Prepares for meeting; Facilitates the discussions.

Host: Prepares a welcoming environment; Prepares/Organizes refreshments. **Communication:** Sends out communication and reminders; Records attendance.

If leading in threes is not an option, then find a co-lead. The co-leader's role is the same as the leader's role in caring and praying for small group members; and can assist the leader with logistics as needed.

Being An Inclusive Small Group Leader

As a small group leader at Love Church, we believe that the Holy Spirit fills us with the power to live a life that honors God and draws others to Him (https://welovechurch.com/about/). As church leaders, we are called to share Jesus with all that we come into contact with (Matthew 28:19; Acts 1:8). To do this, it is important that we understand that we are called to minister to a very diverse community and that there are certain steps we should take to intentionally show love to our neighbors who may view the world differently than we do.

Unfortunately, there are times when Christian communities face challenges in applying these truths from biases we may or may not be aware of (https://www.geneva.edu/about-geneva/diversity). The Bible tells us that love is an action (1 Corinthians 13:4-7; 1 Peter 4:8; Romans 13:9-10). For us to overcome our prejudices and walk in love, we must acknowledge that we all have biases – whether conscious or unconscious – and work for a changed heart towards all people.

About Bias

"Bias is a prejudice in favor of or against one thing, person, or group compared with another usually in a way that's considered to be unfair." Biases may be held by an individual, group, or institution and can have negative or positive consequences. It is important to note that biases, conscious or unconscious, are not limited to ethnicity and race. Though racial bias and discrimination are well documented, biases may exist toward any social group or human characteristic (i.e., groups based on age, gender, religion, weight, and many more).

Unconscious biases are social stereotypes about certain groups of people that individuals form outside their own conscious awareness. Everyone holds unconscious beliefs about various social and identity groups, and these biases stem from one's tendency to organize social worlds by categorizing them. Fortunately, unconscious biases are not permanent,

because as Christians we are being transformed by the renewing of our minds (Romans 12:2), and that transformation happens in the context of Christian community. There are practical steps we can take as small group leaders within this community to help each other combat these biases and let God continue to transform us into the people He has created us to be!

Ways to be Inclusive and Reflect God's Love

"Dear [friends], let's not merely say that we love each other; let us show the truth by our actions" (1 John 3:18)

1. Create an open and welcoming environment that is filled with God's presence.

2. Take the time to really get to know people in your small group and within our church family.

- As you build relationships, you will find that we have more in common than not.
- Take opportunities to celebrate other cultures and have a deeper understanding of others' concerns.

3. Be considerate of the things you say.

- People in our community are attracted to our church family because the Holy Spirit is with us. Therefore, we must be careful about the stories we share (Ecclesiastes 3) and the assumptions we make.

4. Grow your circle.

- Be intentional about creating a small group that is as diverse as our church.
- Approach people in the lobby; get to know someone different and invite them to your group.

5. Consider being led by another Love Church small group leader who has a different background than you.

- This is an excellent opportunity to learn more about others in your church family who may have a different perspective than you.

How To Lead A Small Group Meeting For The First Time

Ways to Prepare

- Pray for the Holy Spirit to lead you as you lead your group.
- As a reminder, email or call the day before your group meets.
- Create name tags for those you have called or emailed.
- Consider having food and snacks available.
- Create an inviting environment.

Typical Flow

- Fellowship (20%)
- Transition (5%)
- Topic/Study/Activity (70%)
- Prayer (5%)

Things To Avoid

- Business recruiting
- Tithes and offerings
- Unapproved speakers or material
- Controversial topics

Prayer: The Secret Sauce

At Love Church, we believe heart-felt prayer is key to leading people to Jesus, and essential to what we do as a church.

Prayer is the <u>foundation</u>. As leaders, it is vital that you set the tone for prayer. When you look to the example of Jesus, you help lay the foundation.

For no one can lay any foundation other than the one we already have - Jesus Christ. 1 Corinthians 3:11, NLT

Intentional prayer <u>covers</u>, <u>protects</u>, and <u>enlightens</u>. It is important to spiritually prepare before group members arrive.

- Humble yourself.
- Invite the presence of the Holy Spirit.
- Ask God to work in the hearts of those He is calling to be there, and prepare them to receive what He wants to impart.
- Pray that members will have a personal revelation and understanding of God's Word.

Prayer is a <u>connecting point</u> for ministry. Offer an opportunity for the ministry of the Holy Spirit to take place in people's lives.

Managing Your Group

Love Church uses a database called Planning Center Online (PCO) to set up groups for sign-ups online. Each small group leader is required to use PCO to manage their group during the semester.

Managing Your Group in PCO


You will need to do the following tasks to manage your group in PCO:


Your Support System

- A Campus Coordinator or Director who will check in with you frequently to ensure you are fed spiritually and cover you in prayer
- Annual leadership training events/rallies will be scheduled to develop and encourage you throughout the year.

Freedom

For the entire law is fulfilled in keeping this one command: "Love your neighbor as yourself." If you bite and devour each other, watch out or you will be destroyed by each other. So I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh. For the flesh desires what is contrary to the Spirit, and the Spirit what is contrary to the flesh. They are in conflict with each other, so that you are not to do whatever you want. But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the law. The acts of the flesh are obvious: sexual immorality, impurity and debauchery; idolatry and witchcraft; hatred, discord, jealousy, fits of rage, selfish ambition, dissensions, factions and envy; drunkenness, orgies, and the like. I warn you, as I did before, that those who live like this will not inherit the kingdom of God. But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law. Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit. Let us not become conceited, provoking and envying each other. Galatians 5:13-26
